

IT'S RENEWAL TIME/ Grace Period!!

Although our membership runs from September 1 through August 31, our renewal period begins June 1 each year. Within the next several weeks, you will be receiving an email with instructions to renew. For your convenience, we have noted several ways in which you can do this:

Option 1: Click the link provided in the email and pay online. **This is the easiest and quickest way to renew.** Once you submit your payment online, your profile is automatically updated with payment information and your expiration date will change to 08/31/2025. No waiting - done! **We do ask that you print your receipt and provide a copy to your Chapter for their records.**

Option 2: You may pay your Chapter and they can submit a Chapter Dues Renewal on your behalf. **This is also an easy way to renew your dues.** It will take a little longer than paying online by the time the Chapter and the National 1VP/National Financial Secretary process the renewal. Although this is done in a timely fashion, please remember, we have thousands of members renewing so things do slow down just a bit between June and August based upon how many choose this method of payment.

***Note to Chapters ~ please make sure your submissions are sent at least monthly.**

Option 3: Print the invoice and mail, along with your check, to the National Financial Secretary. While this is very much an option, it is the least recommended, simply for timing purposes. Once your invoice and payment make it through the mail to her PO Box, she then has to process, scan and email to the National 1VP. Please remember, both the National Financial Secretary and National 1VP are working very hard to get through all of their emails and processing procedures as quickly as possible. **So in a nutshell, this takes the longest to process.**

Renewal notices are automatically generated so you will receive one until your payment is posted and your profile is updated. If you choose option 2 or 3 above, please remember it takes longer to process and you may receive another renewal notice.

If you have **NEW** members joining, we highly recommend they join online. Again, this method is quicker; however, options 2 and 3 above are available as well. **Please use the new membership/associate and transfer forms posted on the website.**

Questions?? Please feel free to reach out to your National 1VP, I am happy to help you through the process. **More membership training coming soon!**

A note from your National Webmaster

As part of our ongoing efforts to ensure effective communication, I am asking all Chapter Presidents and members to double-check their chapter and personal profiles and verify that the email address listed is current and accurate.

Please take a moment to review the following:

1. **Personal Profile:** Ensure your email address is correct and up to date.
2. **Chapter Profile:** Confirm that the email address associated with your chapter is accurate and active.

Chapter Presidents and Membership Chairs – please check with your members to be sure they are receiving emails.

Having accurate contact information is essential for staying connected and receiving important updates. If any corrections are needed, please make them as soon as possible.

We also have an issue where many of the emails sent out by the webmaster are bouncing back, particularly for members using email providers such as AOL, Yahoo, Outlook, and Hotmail, etc. We want to ensure that everyone stays informed.

To help us resolve this issue, we ask that you:

1. **Check Your Spam/Junk Folders:** If you are using one of the affected email providers (AOL, Yahoo, Outlook, Hotmail, etc.), please check your spam or junk folder for our emails. Mark them as “Not Spam” to improve future deliverability.
2. **Whitelist Our Email Address:** If possible, add our sending email address (bsma@memberclicks-mail.net) to your contacts or safe senders list to prevent future issues.

By updating your email information and ensuring that our emails are recognized, we can improve communication across the organization.

If you do not know your personal login credentials for the National Website, please contact the Webmaster@bluestarmothers.us and that information can be sent to you with a temporary password that you will then be able to reset.

Chapter Presidents - If you do not know your Chapter login credentials, contact the Webmaster@bluestarmothers.us to have that reset and sent to you.

It's BSMA Compliance Season!!

It may feel like fall is in the air, but it is also Compliance Season! Compliance Season runs from September 1st through December 1st each fiscal year so we are right in the heart of it!

What is Compliance Season you might ask? Every Department, Chapter, and Auxiliary of Blue Star Mothers of America, Incorporated must submit compliance documents once each year and this is that time. This is a legal obligation, parts of which are required by the IRS and by our State governments and by BSMA. We ask for this documentation because we are required to have it!

So far so good! This year about half of our Departments/Chapters/Auxiliaries have already started submitting their compliance reports and documents. Well done!

We even have a handful of Chapters that have already submitted everything and it has all been approved – this is awesome! You will receive an email from me when that happens for you!



Now let's add you to the list of those with components submitted if you aren't already on it, start submitting your compliance today!

You have been receiving Compliance Training Emails over the last several weeks, I hope you have been saving those for reference and sharing them with your compliance teams, especially with your financial officers. Soon you will receive a summary/review document that contains all this in one email. You can also find the updated Compliance Guide on our National website.

Remember to log in using your Department/Chapter/Auxiliary log in information when you are completing compliance!

Remember to use the most recent forms available, including the most recent Affiliation Agreement signed by our current National Officers in early August right after Convention.

Remember that even if your Chapter closed during the last fiscal year, you still are required to complete many aspects of compliance in order to formally close your obligations to the IRS, to your State, and to BSMA, Inc.

Remember that it does not matter how active your D/C/A is, everyone must complete compliance and it is due no later than December 1st every year.

Remember that submitted does not mean approved or accepted. All of our required compliance documents are reviewed by the N4VP, the N1VP, or the Financial Review Team. If you hear from one of these people, please respond as quickly as possible with the clarifications/corrections they have requested.

Everyone can help us get to 100% compliance – encourage your chapter Sisters along the way! Reach out anytime, I am here to help you!





After various roles, including naval recruiter and language training in Vietnamese, John retired in 1968 as a Lieutenant Commander, a Mustang officer who rose from enlisted ranks. In civilian life, he co-owned an auto parts store, taught in Arizona, and worked as a gunsmith.
